Medics on high alert for Zika virus

The Ministry of Health and Institut Pasteur du Laos last week reported that they have identified the Zika virus in 19 residents of Vientiane who were infected between 2012 and 2015.

More than 1,300 stored blood samples were tested from patients with symptoms similar to the dengue virus. Based on available information to date, the risk assessment of the likelihood of the Zika virus widely circulating in Laos is low, especially as there has been no detection of the virus so far this year.

"Despite the result of this joint assessment between WHO and the Ministry of Health, the government is on high alert and invites all technical partners who are currently working in Laos to monitor the situation. Prevention and response measures are in place," said the Director General of the Communicable Disease Control Department, Dr Bounlay Phommasack.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) is supporting the Ministry of Health to prepare for and respond to

WHO Representative in Laos Dr Juliet Fleischl said "WHO is working with the Ministry of Health in enhancing surveillance to detect the disease, improving laboratory capacity to rapidly identify the virus, providing recommendations for clinical care, developing messages for communities, and activating mosquito control operations and community clean up campaigns.'

The Zika virus is transmitted by Aedes mosquitoes, the same mosquito that transmits dengue and chikungunya. The Zika virus causes a mild illness with a slight fever, rash, red eyes, headache and joint pain. Only 1 in 4 people infected with Zika

will have symptoms. The illness lasts 4 to 7 days.

The virus is known to circulate in Asia, Africa, the Americas and the Pacific. There is also evidence to suggest it has been circulating in Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines and Thailand.

The Zika virus is currently causing large outbreaks in the Americas where there is a possible link to a condition called microcephaly in babies born to mothers infected with the virus during pregnancy.

Microcephaly is a rare condition where a baby has a smaller head size than is normal. This is due to the baby's head developing abnormally in the womb or after birth. Children with microcephaly can have developmental problems as they

In countries that have large Zika virus outbreaks, another condition called Guillain Barre Syndrome (GBS) also appears to be linked to outbreaks of the Zika virus. GBS is a rare condition that causes gradual weakness in the legs, arms and upper body and sometimes leads to total paralysis. Most people recover fully from even the most severe

"Zika prevention measures are critical," advised Dr Fleischl. People can protect themselves from mosquito bites by using insect repellent, wearing light coloured clothes, long sleeves and covering as much of the body as possible, using window screens, and sleeping under mosquito nets, especially during the day when the Aedes mosquitoes are most active.

Everyone should clean in and around their house at least once a week by emptying or covering containers that can hold water, such as buckets, flower pots and tyres, so that mosquitoes cannot CONTINUED PAGE 3

Laos, Hungary sign finance agreement

The governments of Laos and Hungary have signed an agreement on financial cooperation which will serve as a fundamental document for economic cooperation between the two countries in the future.

The agreement was signed in Hungary last week by Ambassador/Permanent Representative of Laos to

Phoukhao Phommavongsa and certifying that Hungary Foreign Affairs and Trade Dr István Mikola.

The event was also attended by other high-ranking officials from both countries.

The agreement will serve as the master document while guidelines for other cooperation agreements can be signed subsequently, including a loan agreement the Republic of Austria Mr and other agreements Hungary.

Hungary's Deputy Minister of intends to assist Laos in the established diplomatic relations areas of agriculture, livestock, fisheries and the processing of green products. Hungary is committed to

providing assistance to Laos amounting to US\$30 million in the near future.

The agreement on financial cooperation is a milestone which should enhance the cooperative relations between Laos and

Laos and Hungary in 1962. Hungary has provided Laos with financial and technological support and helped to develop agriculture in Laos, in a bid to ensure that the quantity and quality of crops grown meets market demand.

The government of Hungary is also helping Laos in the education sector by offering scholarships to Lao citizens on an annual basis.

Laos dismisses reports of illegal ivory trade

Lao authorities have dismissed reports by Thai media, which allege companies in Laos have been smuggling elephant ivory through Thailand with the media citing the kingdom's authorities as seizing tusks.

In the latest reports to emerge in mid December, Thai and other foreign media outlets reported that on December 10 Thai authorities seized 789kg of elephant tusks and 587kg of other wildlife items.



Singapore to train Lao government officials

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Institute of Foreign Affairs on Friday signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) on a Train-The Trainer Programme with Singapore's Nanyang Technological University.

The signing ceremony took place last week at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and was attended by Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs Mr Sengphet Houngboungnouang and other senior ministry officials.

Director General of the Institute of Foreign Affairs Mr Yong Chanthalangsy and Vice President of Nanyang Technological University Prof. Er Meng Hwa signed the MOU.

The aim of the training programme is to enhance the capacity of senior Lao government officials at both the central and provincial levels in good governance, public policy and leadership.

With support from the Lao government and the Temasek Foundation, it is envisaged that the training programme will improve the working performance of government officials and help to accelerate

as a milestone for both Laos and Singapore in enhancing bilateral cooperation in the field of human resource development.

Training courses in Singapore will be divided into three modules each lasting two weeks, with 25 participants attending each session. Participants will learn from experienced professors and experts on various essential issues including good governance, public policy and socio-economic development.

The project is jointly funded by the Lao government, the Temasek Foundation and Nanyang Technological University, who will support 75 senior officials from Laos to study at the university for a two week period in three groups.

The first group of 20 senior officials underwent training last month and the second and third groups will be dispatched to Singapore in the near future.

Speaking to local media, Prof. Er Meng Hwa said "The programme covers a wide range of topics on public administration, public policy and leadership, and human resource management."

> "Nanyang Technological University has been providing training programmes for government officials from Asian countries, especially Asean, including Vietnam, Myanmar, the Philippines and Laos," Prof. Er Meng Hwa said.

"The training programme is more than a training programme. It is not a one way training programme but a collaboration between the Lao government, Nanyang Technological University and the Temasek Foundation," he added.

Laos, Switzerland extend partnership in pilot training

The Ministry of Public Works and Transport will continue to work with the Swiss-based Partners in Aviation and Communication Technologies (PACTEC) to train the next generation of Lao pilots.

The commitment was reaffirmed on Friday after both parties acknowledged the progress of the Civil Aviation Flight Training Centre Professional Pilot Programme phase I.

Based on this success, the ministry's Department of Civil Aviation and PACTEC on Friday signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) that will initiate phase II of the pilot training programme.

The MoU was signed by the Director General of the Department of Civil Aviation, Mr Vanhpheng Chanthaphone, and PACTEC's Programme Manager, Mr Sam Herrmann.

Speaking at the signing ceremony, Mr Vanhpheng said "The first six pilots to be trained in Laos have already obtained their private pilot licences, they have started their night rating and are flying cross-country to places

like Xayaboury, Savannakhet, Champassak and Attapeu. In less than a year they will be commercial pilots with a multiengine rating and an Instrument Flight Rules rating."

The second phase will see the continued recruitment and training of new student pilots along with the training of Lao flight instructors to help the flight training centre become independent and sustainable in the future.

The trainees will attend courses known as "ground school" that cover all the subjects required by the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) and Lao Civil Aviation Safety Regulations.

Flight training will include dual, solo, cross-country, instrument and simulator training in accordance with ICAO and Lao Civil Aviation Safety Regulations requirements.

Looking to the future, in partnership with the Civil Aviation Flight Training Centre, PACTEC is planning to submit a proposal to start the first Aviation Maintenance Training Programme in Laos.

This three-year programme would train aircraft mechanics to ICAO standards. The training centre will send out an invitation for a presentation of the proposed Maintenance Training Programme in the next few weeks.


In 2011, the Department of Civil Aviation and PACTEC began the first basic pilot training in Laos since 1975.

In 2012, the old training centre building was renovated to provide the classrooms and offices needed for the new Civil Aviation Flight Training Centre.

Lao Skyway sponsored the students in the first Aviation Career Preparation Course after training began in 2013.

In 2014, PACTEC imported two Cessna 172 training aircraft and the first batch of six student pilots started flight training in partnership with Lao Skyway.

In 2015, the six student pilots did their first solo flight out of Wattay International Airport. The solo flight is a milestone in the two-year pilot training course, when trainees take the controls of a four-seat, single engine Cessna 172.

Statistics bureau crunches numbers on development plan

The Lao Statistics Bureau of the Ministry of Planning and Investment is developing the National Statistical System to improve and upgrade the quality of its operations.

That was the message from the meeting of the Lao Statistics Bureau on Friday as it summarised its work over the past year and presented a strategic plan for 2016-2020.

The meeting was presided over by bureau Head Dr Samaychanh Boupha and other officials.

The national statistical system development strategy aims to improve and strengthen the foundation of statistical production both in terms of quantity and quality, to ensure the National Statistical System is comparable to international standards, and to increase the credibility of the system by employing best practices.

It also aims to comprehensively make available economic, social and environmental statistics for users which are high quality, timely, transparent and credible; to ensure that the production of official statistics is efficient by using modern information systems and methods; and encourage the public to actively participate in statistical production.

During the meeting Dr Samaychanh presented activities and results under Strategies for the Development of the National Statistical System 2010-2020 and described the limitations encountered.

The meeting also discussed the implementation of the statistics law, the strategic plan for 2016-2020 and the vision for 2030.

Targets will concentrate on improving the quality, reliability, and timeliness of statistics so they can facilitate effective planning and decision making activities by policy makers, plan formulators and researchers, according to the 2010-2020 development strategy.

The capacity and knowledge of staff and statisticians nationwide will also be enhanced so they can meet future development needs.

The bureau also plans to develop the national statistical system to guarantee that all activities ranging from production to dissemination are comparable and compliant with international standards.

This should ensure that the country's actual situation is reflected accurately as the result of efficient methods.

The Lao Statistics Bureau encourages everyone to fulfil their obligations in providing cooperation in collecting data and contributing knowledge through giving feedback and comments on its work.

It is estimated that 450,000 Lao girls and boys will achieve literacy, numeracy and other life skills through the Basic Education Quality and Access in Laos (BEQUAL) programme.

The BEQUAL programme is a managed by Australia and the Ministry of Education and Sports, with additional funding provided by the European Union (EU).

The programme is designed to be rolled out over 10 years, in three phases. The first phase runs from 2015-2019 and will focus on 66 of the most educationally disadvantaged districts in Laos.

This information was revealed during the first Steering Committee meeting of the BEQUAL programme held in Vientiane on Friday, which aimed to endorse a range of initiatives to improve education outcomes for children across Laos, according to the Australian Embassy.

The meeting was co-chaired by Deputy Minister of Education and Sports Ms Sengdeuane Lachanthaboun, Australian Ambassador to Laos Mr John Williams and EU's Acting Chargé d'Affaires to Laos Mr Bryan Fornari.

Targeting the most educationally disadvantaged

districts, the programme will strengthen the quality of teacher training, improve school infrastructure, provide learning materials, and increase participation by the most disadvantaged children – girls, children from remote areas, and students with disabilities.

The meeting reflected on the significant progress achieved during the programme's first eight months, including the provision of 217 scholarships to ethnic teacher trainees and commencing renewal of the national primary curriculum. The meeting also endorsed the priorities and outcomes for BEQUAL over the next four years.

Ms Sengdeuane said the ministry has worked closely with the Australian government and European Union for many years, including as joint co-chairs of the Education Sector Working Group.

"This is a large-scale, longterm programme that will help disadvantaged students to get a better education," she said.

Ambassador Williams said that education was at the very heart of Australia's aid programme in Laos. He said that building on Australia's longstanding investments, BEQUAL was supporting the ministry's core business, working

directly with the ministry at the central, provincial and district levels.

"Through BEQUAL, Australia is working side by side with the ministry to develop the curriculum, teachers and schools needed to ensure that children go to school, stay in primary school, and learn while they are there," he said

Mr Fornari highlighted the partnership between the EU, the ministry and Australia as a good example of effective donor coordination in action.

He said BEQUAL was a comprehensive programme that included a wide range of strategies and actions that would help to improve the quality of basic education and address multiple education challenges.

"The European Union is pleased to partner with the governments of Australia and Laos to help more Lao children access a quality education," Mr Fornari said.

Among the 70 participants were senior representatives from provincial governor offices, provincial education offices, senior managers of education ministry departments and teacher training colleges, BEQUAL technical advisers, development partners, and invited guests.

Asean work plan, connectivity agenda to be adopted at summit

The Initiative for Asean Integration (IAI) Work Plan 3 and the Post-2015 Agenda for Asean Connectivity will be the key two documents adopted by the bloc's leaders at the Asean Summit later this year

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Mr Thongloun Sisoulith revealed the plan when delivering a statement to domestic and foreign media on Saturday after the closing of the Asean Foreign Ministers' Retreat, held in Vientiane.

The two documents are in keeping with Asean's goal to narrow the development gap and enhance regional connectivity, which are two of the eight priorities of Laos as the Asean Chair this year.

"The two key deliverable documents under the Lao PDR's chairmanship are the Initiative for Asean Integration Work Plan 3 and the Post-2015 Agenda for Asean Connectivity," Mr Thongloun said. Implementation of the Asean Community Vision 2025 was a central focus of last week's meeting.

"These two documents, upon adoption by Asean leaders at the summit in September, will form an integral part of the Asean Community Vision 2025," Mr Thongloun said.

Of Asean's 10 member countries, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar and Vietnam still lag behind the bloc's founder members. It is widely recognised that this development gap is hindering the integration process, leading to the launch of the IAI Work Plan.

Concerning the Asean Community Vision 2025, Mr Thongloun, who chaired the Ministers' Retreat, said the launch of the Asean Community on December 31, as well as the adoption of the Asean Community together with the three Asean Community blueprints, has boosted momentum for ongoing efforts to consolidate and strengthen regional integration and community building.

Asean leaders adopted the Master Plan on Asean Connectivity in October 2010, aiming to promote economic growth, narrow development gaps, boost Asean integration and community building, enhance competitiveness in Asean, promote deeper social and cultural understanding as well as greater mobility, and connect member states within the region and with the rest of the world.

The Asean Political-Security
Blueprint and the strengthening
of Asean's external relations and
Asean centrality in the evolving
regional architecture were also on
the agenda of the Asean Foreign
Ministers' Retreat. The ministers
discussed ways and means to
further deeper cooperation with
dialogue partners as well as
strengthen engagement with

other external parties.

They exchanged views on regional and international issues of common interest and concern, including security challenges such as terrorism, cyber security, natural disasters, climate change, irregular migration, human trafficking, maritime cooperation and cooperation, and developments in the Middle East, Korean Peninsula and the South China Sea. The ministers reaffirmed Asean's commitment to working with the international community to combat terrorism in all its forms.

Concerning the nuclear test by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) and the country's rocket launch, the ministers reiterated Asean's full support for the denuclearisation of the Korean Peninsula in a peaceful manner. They urged the DPRK to comply with all the United Nations Security Council resolutions and called on parties involved to make a concerted effort to maintain peace and security.

With regard to the South China Sea, the ministers were seriously concerned about developments there and took note of the concerns expressed by some ministers on land reclamation and the escalation of activities in the area, saying these had eroded trust and confidence, increased tension, and may undermine peace, security and stability in the region.

use them to breed. "WHO advises that women who are pregnant or who are planning to become pregnant should take extra care to protect themselves from mosquito bites," Dr Fleischl said.

Women who are pregnant should discuss their travel plans with their health care provider and consider delaying travel to any area where locally acquired Zika infection is occurring.

The virus is spread by mosquitoes, and not by person-to-person contact, though a small number of cases of sexual transmission have been documented. Zika has been found in human semen. Two reports have described cases where Zika has been transmitted from one person to another through sexual contact. Until more is known about the risk of sexual transmission, all men and women returning from an area where Zika is circulating - especially pregnant women and their partners - should practice safe sex, including through the correct and consistent use of condoms.

At the global level, WHO is coordinating with countries that have reported outbreaks of the Zika virus and other partners to investigate and respond to the potential relationship between Zika and microcephaly, as well as any other possible complications.

by Thai media, including a report by Thai Channel 3, which alleged that two Lao companies were involved in the illegal trade of elephant tusks seized by Thai authorities with the tusks allegedly shipped through Thailand destined for Laos.

The Thai media reports alleged that two Lao companies – Manisouk Trading Lao and Soukpasong Import-Export - were supposedly to receive the tusks, which were seized by Thai authorities on April 2 and April 26 last year en route through Thailand.

Following its investigations, the Lao ministry confirmed there were no companies registered under the names Manisouk Trading Lao and Soukpasong Import-Export.

To address the issue and find out the truth, the ministry said Lao officials would contact and

work with their Thai counterparts to investigate the matter further.

The ministry said Laos attached great importance to preserving wildlife, especially endangered species as the Lao PDR had been a state party to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora since 2004.

"The implementation of the convention has been a priority for the Lao government," the ministry said in its statement.

Observers said it was important for Lao officials to take urgent action to address the issue and find out the truth as soon as possible as the allegations were tarnishing Laos' image. They noted that Lao officials should take quicker action given that the allegations first surfaced in April last year and similar allegations had already been made on three occasions.

Korean experts mull upgrade of skills development institute

The Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) has sent a group of Korean experts to Vientiane to undertake a preliminary study for a project to improve the Lao-Korea Skills Development Institute.

The group was in Vientiane from February 18 to 27 in cooperation with local and international experts, according to the KOICA Laos office.

The main objectives of the study are to assess the feasibility of the proposed project plan by the Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare and the institute as well as develop a project design.

The experts held meetings with government officials, development partners in the technical and vocational education and training sector, and local company stakeholders about a situation analysis, data collection, a budget estimate and a review of the project's implementation.

Resident Representative of the KOICA Laos office, Mr Kim Hahng-Joo, said "The project is expected to contribute to human resource development in Laos and present a solution to the

shortage of skilled workers. Therefore, it can meet the needs of rapidly increasing industrial demands."

Ambassador of the Republic of Korea to Laos, Mr Kim Soo-Kwon, said "Korea is a country developed by a skilled workforce and high technology. I hope the institute can meet the expectations of Lao students so they have an opportunity

to learn about Korea's leading technology through this improvement project."

The Lao-Korea Skills Development Institute offers nine courses including automobile repair, IT, electricity, beauty and more, to over 1,500 students.

The institute first opened its doors in 2002 with KOICA support of US\$2 million. Since

then, KOICA has constantly supported the institute by carrying out a series of projects as well as dispatching KOICA Overseas Volunteers.

If the feasibility of the project is successfully examined through the study, it is expected that KOICA will fund a second upgrade of the institute with up to US\$5 million from 2017 to 2020.

News in Brief

Drug dealers fined, jailed

Four Vientiane drug dealers were each given five year prison sentences and a fine of 10 million kip each, while another was sentenced to six years in jail and fined 28 million kip.

A report in the *Khuamsangob* Newspaper named the men as Mr Aek, 23, Mr Khutthachan, 22, Mr Bounsong, 25, and Mr Phonesin, 21. The fifth man was named as Mr Kataithong, 25.

Police said they first arrested Mr Kataithong who confessed to trading in drugs since 2013. He said he bought between 50-200 pills at a time from Mr Aek, which he later sold to Mr Khutthachan, Mr Phonesin, and Mr Bounsong.

Red Cross hoping for 1,500 blood donors this month

The Lao Red Cross has set a target for 1,500 people to donate blood this month and is running a campaign to encourage donors to come forward and boost supplies. As of Friday, 1,059 people had donated blood. Officials are holding blood donation drives at16 companies, schools and universities, the *Vientiane Mai* Newspaper reported.

Myanmar triples expenditure on electricity supply in five years

YANGON (Xinhua) -- Myanmar has tripled its expenditure on electricity supply over the past five years, an official report said Sunday quoting Deputy Minister of Electric Power U Maw Tha

In the fiscal year 2015-16 ending March, the government invested US\$481 million, up from US\$143 million USD, he said.

Noting that the country's individual consumption of electricity stands at 222 kilowatts, the deputy minister revealed the installed capacity of electricity of Myanmar rose from 3,400 megawatts (MW) in 2010 to 5,089 MW in 2015 and electricity has been distributed to 15,000 of 60,000 villages across the country.

He further said Myanmar's National Electrification Plan, conducted in partnership with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) since 2012, aims to enable all parts of the country to have full access to electricity by 2030.

However, the plan has just covered 33 percent of the whole country, he disclosed, saying that much remains to be done to meet the target as only one third of the country's 50.89 million population live with electricity.

Statistics indicate that in Myanmar, 66 percent of electricity comes from hydropower, 29 percent from gas-fired power and 3 percent from coal-fired ones and the rest from wind, solar and

Thailand has third most suicides in the world

THAILAND (The Nation, ANN) -- Boken hearts and family issues were the most common reasons for Thais committing suicide, averaging around 300 a month or 4,000 cases a year, making it the third country with the most suicides, Public Health Ministry spokesman and psychiatrist Dr Yongyuth Wongpiromsan said.

Japan reported the highest number of suicides, followed by Sweden and Scandinavian countries

Yongyuth, also chief adviser to the Mental Health Department (MHD), said the most commonly used methods were hanging (70 percent), poisoning (20 percent) and shooting (10 percent).

He said most suicides were committed by men.

Major contributing factors included loss of self-control following excessive drinking of alcohol; health issues such as depression or chronic illness as many people, especially the elderly, did not want to be a burden on their children; family issues such as domestic violence; disappointment in love and the feeling of being abandoned or neglected, he added.

"In Thailand, most suicide cases involved people in the working age - late 20s to 50s who suffered from conflict in love, family issues, were overwhelmed by debt, as well as stress from work," he said.

This affected the country's labour situation as Thailand's ratio of working-age to suicide was now at six per 100,000 population. He urged people to seek advice from the MHD hotline 1667

Saudi-led airstrikes in Yemen kill over 30, mostly civilians

SANAA, Yemen (AP) -- Saudi-led airstrikes targeting Shiite rebels killed at least 30 people, mostly civilians, when they hit a market area outside the capital on Saturday, Yemeni security

They said the raid hit the popular market in the Nihm district, killing at least 22 civilians and leaving burned bodies strewn across the area. The officials, who are neutral in a conflict that has split the armed forces, spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorised to brief reporters.

The strike comes a day after aid and rights groups urged Western countries to stop selling arms to Saudi Arabia, which is striking the Iran-backed rebels, known as Houthis, to support forces loyal to the internationally recognised government. The Houthis overran the capital, Sanaa, and other Yemeni cities in 2014.

The UN says the fighting in Yemen has killed more than 6,000 people since March 2015 and wounded more than 35,000.

The Control Arms Coalition said in a report Friday that 11 countries - including France, Britain, the US and Germany -sold arms such as drones, missiles and bombs worth US\$25 billion to the Saudis in 2015. This Monday, governments that signed the Arms Trade Treaty, which has the aim of "reducing the human suffering" by imposing restrictions on arms sold to countries that violate international law, will meet in Geneva.

European Union lawmakers have also called for an EU arms embargo against Saudi Arabia over the airstrikes and naval blockade imposed on Yemen, despite lobbying by the kingdom.

Raise on way for gov't workers, military personnel

PHILIPPINES (The Philippine Daily Inquirer, ANN) – Starting Monday, the budget department will be releasing to various government agencies a total of P24 billion to cover the additional salaries of civilian employees and the new allowances of military and uniformed personnel, Budget Secretary Butch Abad said Saturday.

The money to be released by the Department of Budget and Management will be sourced from the miscellaneous personnel benefits fund in the P3.002-trillion 2016 budget.

The initial tranche of pay adjustments granted by Executive Order (EO) No. 201 signed by President Aquino earlier this month will require P57 billion, the bulk of which would be released within the first half of the year.

"Of the P24 billion, P18.64 billion will augment the compensation of civilian personnel, while P5.36 billion will go to the allowances and hazard pay of military and uniformed personnel," Abad said.

The pay-out for civilian workers and military and uniformed personnel is based on data from the Government Manpower Information System which show the number of filled positions as of December 31, 2015

According to Abad, the balance of P33 billion has been "set aside for newly filled positions and for the midvear bonus, which will be released not earlier than May 15 of this year."

The appropriations for civilian personnel include the following: Salary differential, step increment due to length of service, 13th-month pay differential, PhilHealth differential, employees compensation insurance premiums differential, and retirement and life insurance premiums differential.

That of military and uniformed personnel will cover the monthly provisional allowance, monthly officers' allowance as well as the increase in monthly hazard pay to P390 from the P240.

Indian PM comes under fire for campaign against corruption

INDIA (The Statesman, ANN) -- For the second time this week, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday said he has become an "eyesore" for those affected by his crusade to end blackmarketing and corruption, asserting this campaign has turned them against him.

With his government coming under attack on diverse subjects, Modi also said the Opposition spoke of many issues but there was not an allegation of corruption against his government ever since he has been serving as "pradhan sevak"

Stating that the government has stopped black-marketing and corruption in the fertiliser sector, he asked farmers to use only neem coated urea and also take the new crop insurance income to boost their income.

He also announced that all farmers would get soil health cards by 2017.

Addressing a farmers rally here as part of BJP's nationwide outreach to farmers, Modi said earlier there used to be blackmarketing of urea and farmers had to face lathi-charge to get urea but now the situation has improved as the government has focused on raising the output and checking the diversion of urea.

Modi said he has not received any letters from the States this year demanding the fertiliser.

"We have taken a big step to put an end to corruption and blackmarketing of urea. This is the reason why some of these people keep shouting against me. They will obviously be angry with Modi as blackmarketing has been checked," he said.

"Modi is an eyesore for them as the corruption that they have been engaging for last 60 years has come to a halt," he said, adding, "they ate things for free (mufat ki malai khayi hui hai)

and that has been closed now, this is the reason."

Slamming critical NGOs and black-marketeers, Modi had on Sunday accused them of conspiring to destabilise his government and "defame" him and asserted that he will carry on with his work without bowing to any machinations.

Modi reminded farmers of his promise before the (Lok Sabha) elections that till he was here, no one would be able to lay their hands on Delhi's treasury.

"Today we have been able to stop malpractices in fertilisers and have brought in neem coated urea," he said.

Modi also said if there was a ray of hope in the world economy, it was India, as he asserted that his government was committed to transform the lives of the poor and villages.

"Today it is agreed that if there is a ray of hope in the world economy, it is India," Modi said.



KABUL, Afghanistan (AP) -- Suicide bombers targeted an anti-Taliban tribal leader in eastern Afghanistan and the Defense Ministry compound in the capital, Kabul, killing at least 23 people on Saturday and wounding dozens more, officials said.

A suicide bomber on a motorcycle attacked tribal leader Khan Jan in the eastern Kunar province, killing him and 10 other civilians, said Gen. Abdul Habib Sayedkhaili, the provincial police chief.

Jan was a vocal public opponent of the Taliban and was leading local fighters against the insurgents.


More than 40 others civilians were wounded in the attack, which took place in the provincial capital, Asadabad, said Sayedkhaili.

No group claimed

responsibility for the attack, but provincial officials said they suspected the Taliban.

The suicide bomber who struck near the Defense Ministry compound killed 12 people, including two military personnel, the ministry said in a statement.

The blast rocked the capital and sent a column of white smoke into the sky. Security forces blocked the main road in front of the ministry. Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid claimed responsibility for the Kabul attack in an email sent to media.

Russia, US exchange information to ensure Syrian ceasefire

MOSCOW (Xinhua) -- Russia and the United States have exchanged information on the current ceasefire in Syria, a Russian senior military official said Saturday.

The shared information relates to areas in Syria where the latest ceasefire is applied and where armed groups are deployed, according to Sergei Rudskoi, head of the Russian Defense Ministry's Main Operational Directorate.

For the exchange of information, Russia has developed a map depicting the situation in Syria and forwarded it to the US side on Friday during the two sides' consultations in Amman, Jordan, said Rudskoi.

In an official transcript,

Rudskoi said the map marked areas where reconciliation work is being carried out among conflicting Syrian parties.

"During the Amman consultations, we received a similar map prepared by the American side. The list of armed units, according to the US delegation, was sent to us via diplomatic channels," he said, adding that the Russian side is working on matching the acquired information with the data they have.

According to Rudskoi, Russia has shared with the US side a list of armed groups totaling 6,111 people that had abided by the ceasefire, as well as 74 towns and regions that should be excluded from airstrikes.

He added that Russia also sent to the US side on Saturday a proposal with standard terms and procedures necessary to ensure the cessation of hostilities.

Should ceasefire violations be confirmed, he said, Russia and the United States will take measures to de-escalate tensions, while urging all powers with real influence on the conflicting parties in Syria to make all efforts possible to ensure the implementation of the ceasefire agreement.

Noting that Moscow has fully abided by its commitments to the ceasefire since it came into effect, Rudskoi said his country is using multiple means of intelligence devices, including drones and satellites, to monitor the ceasefire on a daily basis.

Bolivian leader's ex-lover held in corruption probe

LA PAZ, Bolivia (AP) -- The former lover of President Evo Morales who was working as a high-ranking executive at a Chinese firm has been arrested as part of a probe into alleged influence trafficking involving hundreds of millions of dollars in government contracts.

Gabriela Zapata was expected to be charged Saturday with illegal enrichment, laundering of unjust gains and influence trafficking, according to her lawyer. She was taken into custody on Friday at the request of Bolivia's anticorruption agency, who argued she was a flight risk.

The bombshell revelation this month of Morales' past relationship with Zapata upended the final stretch of a referendum campaign aimed at allowing the president to seek re-election when his current term ends in 2020. Morales narrowly lost the vote, delivering a major blow to his decade-old leftist government.

Morales during the campaign acknowledged the relationship and said the two even had a child together in 2007, but that the infant later died.

In another twist, Zapata's aunt said Saturday that the child

was still alive and named Ernesto Fidel.

"My niece will soon provide more information, she wants to talk," Pilar Guzman told ATB television on Saturday.

Zapata, 29, declined to speak when she was arrested on Friday.

In 2013, Zapata became general manager for Bolivia of China CAMC Engineering Co. Ltd., whose seven contracts with the state, all but one no-bid, are worth more than US\$500 million.

Authorities in Puerto Rico seize nearly half-ton of cocaine

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP) -- Federal authorities in Puerto Rico are investigating the origin of almost a half-ton of cocaine seized last week from a shipping container at San Juan port, officials said Saturday.

In a statement, the US Customs and Border Protection said officers found 910 pounds (413 kilograms) of cocaine worth an estimated US\$11.5 million during an inspection after an X-ray of the container revealed irregularities. Several brickshaped objects wrapped in plastic bags contained a substance that tested positive for cocaine.

CBP Public Affairs Officer Jeffrey Quinones said in a telephone interview that the seizure

occurred on a domestic container headed toward the continental US.

"We did a random inspection of domestic containers. It is not something we do normally, but we do it every so often randomly," Quinones said.

Quinones said authorities didn't want to give any additional information because Homeland Security Investigations special agents are probing the matter. In a separate bust on February 21, authorities seized 796 pounds of cocaine worth US\$8 million at sea east of Puerto Rico and arrested 10 people. Federal authorities in San Juan said narcotic seizures increased 93 percent to 48,572 pounds during fiscal year 2015.

China is on good path, Kim says

SHANGHAI (China Daily, ANN) -- China has realised communication and the world is going to seemore transparency and clarity about China's decision-making, the World Bank president told China Daily on the sidelines of the G20

"I met Premier Li Keqiang the critical importance of on Wednesday, and he told me they had realised the importance of communication. A lot of suspicion is that things are happening, but the global community is not sure why things are being done. ... The fact that you tell what exactly your intention is, interms of fiscal policy, monetary policy, status of structural reform, that kind of communication will go a long way to dispel the doubts," World Bank President Jim Yong

Such communication is critically important on the exchange rate issue, he said, an issue that grabbed the world's attention during the meeting. Kim cited People's Bank of China's Governor Zhou Xiaochuan's recent communication as showing China's progress.

"The biggest issue about the renminbi is people fear they don't know how decisions are being made. Now Governor Zhou is coming out and saying they are looking at a basket of currencies and making decisions based on the yuan's relation with a basket of currencies.

"China is on a very good path. Governor Zhou is communicating, he is even communicating in English, which I think is really important. What you are going to see is more transparency," hesaid.

The importance of communication also applies to the Chinese economy.

"Chinese leaders have said they are going to move away from a strategy based oninvestment and export to consumption and service. That's happening. China is engaging inreforms in the financial sector, hukou (household registration) system and healthcare sector,"Kim

"We are working with them on these reforms. We are right here on the ground to work withChina, so we are much more optimistic about what's happening here than some observersfrom outside," he said.

However, Kim said it is critical for China to "maintain the momentum of structural reform". Thesecond issue is to keep communicating, and more frequently and broadly.

BOJ may further ease policy as deflation concerns grow

TOKYO (Xinhua) -- Japan's consumer prices remained flat in January compared to the same period a year earlier, as a protracted downturn in energy prices and a comparatively firm yen may lead the key gauge to enter negative territory and the central bank to intervene, data from the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications showed on Friday.

The consumer price index (CPI) reading in the recording period, which excludes volatile fresh food prices, stood at 102.6 against the 2010 base of 100, the statistics bureau said.

The data set showed that energy prices had fallen 10.7 percent in the recording period, amid an ongoing slump in global prices for crude oil, while gasoline prices in Japan tumbled 16.6

Following more than a 22 percent surge in the previous month, TV prices rose 15.8 percent, the ministry said, with food prices logging an increase of 2.1 percent.

The latest reading follows a negligible 0.1 percent rise in the previous two months, underscoring the Bank of Japan's (BOJ) struggle to combat decades of rampant deflation in Japan and achieve its 2 percent inflation target, despite unrolling a number of qualitative and quantitative easing measures.

Such measures, most recently, included the BOJ plunging its interest rate into negative territory in a bid to shore up the economy which contracted in the last quarter, as falling oil prices, waning domestic consumption and sluggish imports, continued to impact overall growth and the bank's reflationary efforts.

South Korea's auto market ranks 10th place in 2015

S.KOREA (The Korea Herald, ANN) -- South Korea's automobile market grew 10.3 percent in 2015 to become the world's 10th largest in vehicle sales, data showed on Friday.

More than 1.83 million domestically made and imported cars were sold here last year, accounting for 2 percent of auto sales around the world, according to the data compiled by the Korea Automobile Manufacturers' Association.

That was up a notch from 2014 when the country was the 11th-largest auto sales market.

KAMA said the increase in auto sales was partly due to a tax cut on auto purchases and strong demand for SUVs

China posted sales of more than 24.6 million new cars last year, up 4.7 percent from a year earlier to account for 26.8 percent of global sales. China remained the world's

largest automobile market for the seventh consecutive year.

The number of vehicles sold in the United States rose 5.9 percent on-year last year to 17.84 million, making the US No.2 market for new vehicles.

Japan ranked third with 5.04 million vehicles sold last year, down 9.4 percent from a year earlier, followed by Germany with sales of 3.54 million vehicles, India with 3.42 million and Britain with 3.06 million.

Meanwhile, global auto sales edged up 1 percent onyear in 2015 to reach 91.65 million.

In terms of auto production, China again topped the list in auto production last year with 24.5 million units. The US came in second with 12.1 million, followed by Japan with 9.28 million and Germany with 6.19 million.

South Korea ranked fifth with 4.56 million, the data showed.

World Trade Center transit hub opens under cloud of US\$4B cost

NEW YORK (AP) -- The soaring, white transportation hub opening next week at the World Trade Center was designed to evoke a bird in flight, but it is hatching under a cloud.

There will be no ribboncutting celebration when the train station's grand hall, called the Oculus, opens this coming week because the head of the bi-state agency that controls the hub has blasted it as a "symbol of excess," with runaway costs approaching US\$4 billion.

That's roughly the same price as the nation's tallest skyscraper, next door — the 104-story One World Trade

Cente

"The cost of projects, big and small, matters — a lot," Patrick Foye, executive director of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, said in a statement through a spokesman. "Whether due to unforeseen conditions, errors or misconduct, cost overruns consume precious resources and undermine public confidence."

After first indicating that there would be no ceremony at all, officials with the authority said late on Thursday that the transit facility would partially open on March 3 and that there would be a ceremony when it becomes "fully operational"

later this spring.

Ribbon cutting or not, the hub, which includes a commuter rail station, retail shops and connections to several subway lines, appears destined to take its place among the city's most talked-about landmarks.

Intended to serve partly as a monument to the victims of the September 11, 2001, attacks, the hub was designed by Spanish-born architect Santiago Calatrava to convey the feeling of a bird released into the air, with steel wings poised for takeoff. Some critics have compared it to a dinosaur skeleton or an armadillo.

Turkey repairs oil pipeline connecting to Iraqi Kurdistan

ISTANBUL (AP) -- Turkey's energy ministry says it has begun repairs to a pipeline transporting crude oil from northern Iraq to the Mediterranean coast.

The ministry said Saturday the delivery of crude oil via the Kirkuk-Ceyhan pipeline

The ministry said Saturday the delivery of crude oil via the Kirkuk-Ceyhan pipeline came to a halt February 17 after it was attacked by militants from the Kurdistan Workers' Party, or PKK. The PKK launched another attack against the pipeline Thursday near the southeastern town of Idil in Sirnak province.

But the ministry now says "security forces have taken necessary steps to ensure the pipeline's safety ... we expect to restart the oil delivery soon."The pipeline is a vital source of revenue for the Kurdish regional government in northern Iraq and cuts across restive areas of southeastern Turkey where Turkish security forces are trying to route Kurdish militants.

German companies more cautious to recruit in February

MUNICH, Germany (Xinhua) -- German companies are increasingly skeptical about recruiting new employees, although they are continuing to create new jobs, the Ifo research institute reported on Friday.

According to the report, the Ifo employment barometer index fell to 108.0 points in February from 109.7 points last month.

The barometer in manufacturing remains at a weak level due to growing general uncertainty with regard to the economic situation in the sector. And the barometer in service sector saw its steepest decline in all of three years, the Munich-based think tank reported.

Italy's eyewear sector sees upward trend in post crisis era

MILAN (Xinhua) -- 2015 was an excellent one in the post-economic crisis era for Italy's eyewear sector, industry experts said here on Friday.

At the opening conference of MIDO, the Milan eyewear show which runs from Saturday to Monday, it was announced that in 2015, Italian eyewear production totaled 3.6 billion euros (US\$3.9 billion), up by 12.5 percent over 2014.

In 2015, there were 870 companies in the country, 0.2 percent more compared to 2014. Exports of frames, sunglasses and lenses, which account for almost 90 percent of production by the sector, rose by 12.3 percent over 2014 to 3.4 billion euros.

US economic growth revised higher to 1 pct in Q4 of 2015

WASHINGTON (Xinhua) -- US economy in the fourth quarter of 2015 expanded faster than previously estimated, as companies' inventory investment decreased less than previously estimated.

The US gross domestic product (GDP) increased at an annual rate of 1 percent during September-December 2015, higher than the advance estimate of 0.7 percent, said the Commerce Department on Friday.

In 2015, the real GDP increased 2.4 percent, the same rate as in 2014. The upward revision was largely due to a smaller decline in inventory investment than originally estimated, which subtract 0.14 percentage point from the fourth-quarter GDP growth.

Bank of Albania moves to tackle bad loans

TIRANA (Xinhua) -- The Bank of Albania will present a solution plan in March to deal with 35 companies that take 52 percent of the country's bad loans, local media reported on Saturday.

The bank said it will give details about which companies will stay in the market and which ones be forced into bankruptcy, according to the Albanian Daily News.8 Around seven companies will run into bankruptcy, the report cited sources as saying. According to official data, the 35 companies have a total of over US\$500 million in bad loans, which became the main source of uncertainties in the national economy and financial system.

Vietnam courts Russian tourists

HANOI (Vietnam News, ANN) -- Vietnam aims to receive 400,000 Russian visitors in 2016 and one million by 2020, Vietnam National Administration of Tourism's (VNAT) Deputy Director-General Nguyen Quoc Hung

Speaking at a conference in Moscow on Wednesday, he said VNAT and the concerned Russian authorities had agreed to implement a series of measures to reach these targets.

According to statistics from VNAT, the number of Russians who visited Vietnam in February soared 8.9 percent to touch 73,898.

Deputy Chairman of Vietnam Tourism Association (VITA) Vu TheBinh said the fact that about 300,000 Russian visitors travelled to Vietnam was not commensurate with the relationship between Vietnam and Russia.

VITA has been partnering with VNAT and Ha Noi City to promote Vietnamese tourism in the two major cities of Moscow and St Petersburg, with the aim of attracting more Russian

working with Vietnamese tourist firms to implement a stimulus programme for official, believed the target of

the Russian market. The programme will focus on new tourism products, with large discounts and trained staff, he said.

Singapore banks 2015 results show rising pressure on asset quality and profitability: Moody's

SINGAPORE (The Straits because they point to reduced agency Moody's Investors Service Singapore said in a report released on Thursday that the latest quarterly results of Singapore's three major banks - DBS, OCBC and UOB - show the rising pressure on their asset quality and profitability:

On Monday, DBS Group Holdings reported full-year 2015 results that revealed sizable oil and gas exposures on its books.

DBS' results followed announcements the previous week by Oversea Chinese Banking Corp and United Overseas Bank showing similar exposures.

The three banks' oil and gas exposures are credit negative

Times, ANN) -- Credit rating asset quality amid currently low oil prices.

All three banks reported higher nonperforming loans (NPLs) in 2015 as the rout in oil prices has negatively affected domestic loans, while headwinds, particularly in Indonesia and Greater China, have hurt foreign loans.

DBS outperformed OCBC and UOB, reporting the smallest NPL increase last

We expect that the asset quality of all three banks will continue to deteriorate because of slowing economic and trade growth in Asia, and increasing stress for oil and gas borrowers in Singapore.

The banks' large exposures

to oil services companies are particularly risky because these companies have been most affected by the collapse in oil

Singapore banks' exposures to oil and gas services firms are a significant 13-25 percent of their common equity Tier 1 capital. Despite its better NPL record until now, DBS reported the highest exposure of the three banks.

According to DBS, only 1.3 percent of loans to oilsupport-services borrowers are already nonperforming. Based on the bank's stress test, which assumes that oil prices remain at US\$20 per barrel over the next two years, the bank estimates that it would need to make additional loan impairments totaling around SGD200 million (about seven basis points of 2015 gross loans).

Meanwhile, OCBC regional macroeconomic reported that 14 percent of its loans to oil services borrowers are nonperforming and are already reflected in its 2015 NPL ratio. UOB expects that up to 20 percent of oil and gas loans would become nonperforming if oil prices remain low this year, with the largest deterioration coming from support services. If UOB were to classify 20 percent of its oil and gas loans as NPLs as of year-end 2015, its NPL ratio would increase to 2.6 percent from the reported 1.4 percent.

Kloset's "Woman on the Moon" Collection, which was inspired by the work of artist Paul Gauguin, reinterpreted patterns, textures and palettes with deep colours like maroon and mustard combined with violet, green, beige and light blue. Traditional island prints got a modern makeover and a swallow also made an appearance, as a symbol to encourage those who have a dream to spread their wings.

Issue, meanwhile, focused on cultural diversity with a "Peranakan" collection inspired by the Chinese and Malayu heritage with mixed prints for the ladies and flowing coats for the men. Bhubawit "Roj" Kritpholnara, Issue's founder and designer, paid tribute to Asian beauty through collage and resin work finely hand-stitched on dresses to create one-of-a-kind

Senada went whimsical for its "Into the Woods" collection working with two themes - the great outdoors and sophisticated indoors. The collection featured Senada's usual splash of vintage charm, with '60s and '70s-inspired A-line silhouettes, knee length to floor length skirts, cute day dresses, elegant accordion pleat details, ruffles, peter pan lace collars, smocked cuffs and flowing circular skirts. Extravagant fabrics and techniques like tweed, lace trimmings, crochet and delicate flower embroideries were extensively incorporated with sheer and silky materials, adding a sensual edge to an otherwise sophisticated set.

Playhound brought summer vibes to its "Cut Outs" collection, mimicking the technique of artist Henri Matisse to give the clothes a fun feel. Silhouettes were comfortable and easy to mix and match with the separates featuring everything from a bomber jacket, jumpsuit, sweater and hoodie jacket to sports bikinis, cropped tops, mini dresses and bathrobes. The menswear was given surfer attitude with colourful bandanas. sweat pants, swimming trunks, Hawaiian shirts and plenty of

Linen, cotton, light knits and rayon were the fabrics of choice and these were often given a sporty edge through the addition of mesh and jersey. Here again, the colour palette boasted vibrant reds, greens and blues tempered

Jamini Roy: First modernist of Indian art

NEW DELHI (The Statesman, ANN) -- Noted modernist artist Jamini Roy's nearly century old paintings have lived beyond their time and find relevance even today.

Uma Nair, who has curated an ongoing solo exhibition at the Dhoomimal Art Gallery here showcasing nearly 80 artworks by 20th century calls him a "universalist."

"Jamini Roy is never out of fashion. Whatever he drew was universal. It is relevant even today. It is so important for works of art to live beyond its time," she says of the artist who passed away in 1972.

Titled "Carved Contours," the show underway at the Dhoomimal Gallery here is divided into two distinct parts one set of coloured works and another of pen and ink drawings.

Roy who was tutored under the Bengal School of Art under the mentorship of Abanindranath Tagore, shifted from the academic tradition of drawing classical nudes and went on to derive inspiration from the Indian culture.

He captured the simplicity of the tribal livelihood in his art where he painted extensively the "marginalised" santhal community of Bengal.

"His main subjects were the humble simple people from the santhal tribe. His soft heartedness towards the community comes out of his sensitivity for the poor. In today's world when we hear about atrocities against Dalits, here is an artist who celebrated people who were marginalised," says Nair.

Roy's treatment of the female body is sensitive and respectful in a way that it appears sensuous rather than crude and vulgar to the viewer.

"I think he was very sensitive. He appreciated women. When you look at the forms of the women he does not make her look cheap but beautiful," says

the curator.

Even though the artist seldom paints the faces but whatever one sees in Roy's women is all beautiful.

"He is a man who loved what he saw. In today's age when we are talking about violence against women, I think respect is very important and I realise Jamini Roy was a humanist,"

Roy's coloured works show clear influences of the Kalighat patta paintings in his bold sweeping brush-strokes. He also turned to rural decorative traditions of alpana and kantha. artist's choice of medium of work was egg tempera and tamarind seed glue and that he soon switched from dyes to natural colors, using earth, chalk powder and vegetable

"His palette was a limited array of seven colours – Indian red, yellow ochre, cadmium green, vermillion, grey and blue – prepared from materials like hingul, harital, kak khokri, lamp black chalk or limestone," she says.

The "mother-child" figure is another recurrent subject in Roy's works, which he blends effortlessly with his other areas of interest of the santhals and bauls, mythology – both Hindu and Christian.

Roy's depiction of the selflessness of motherhood in santhal woman embracing her child; a bronze bodied santhal

mother feeding an infant - is indeed heartwarming.

"He loves portraying Ganesh and Durga, as well as Krishna, especially the child Krishna and scenes from the Ramayan," says Nair.

The show has a series of simple monumental images of sari-clad women, village dancers and domestic animals besides Madonna and Christ and the famed Ramayan series. According to the curator, Roy has dealt with the idea of 'Ravana' in a very contemporary way. Unlike his other works which have a very matte finish, According to Nair says the this particular work depicting the evil king with his 10 heads positioned diagonally in 'tomato red' exudes an uncanny liveliness.

> "He has treated it in a very modern way. Whenever you and I think of Ravana, we think of him standing with his ten heads horizontal. He takes the Ravana and makes his heads diagonal. He gives so much joy in the destruction of evil," she says.

A 110-page book, brought out by Dhoomimal Gallery, caries a foreword by Uma Jain and curatorial note by Uma Nair and a couple of art writeups besides a brief biography of Jamini and the images of all his works at 'Carved Contours'.

All the images from the exhibition are from the Uma and Ravi Jain Estate.

The month long exhibition his paintings - an image of a inaugurated recently at the galley, which turns 80 this year, is set to continue till March 10.

How should outstanding students be rewarded?

Many students hit the books and work diligently in the hope that rewards will come their way. But after the excitement of graduation and a good grade they are disappointed that their efforts seem not to be appreciated. Many people are concerned about this and feel that the Ministry of Education and Sports should provide them with job opportunities or a scholarship. Vientiane Times asked people for their thoughts on how deserving students should be rewarded.

Mr Alinkom Sypavong, a doctor at Mahosot Hospital: Some people think that top students, especially those



who get a red certificate, get some form of special support from the government after

graduation, but in fact this is not the case. I have heard many people, especially university students, talking about this issue. They say that being an outstanding student and receiving a red certificate does not distinguish them in any way from students who don't receive one, as there was no special reward either on their graduation day or afterwards. This leaves them disappointed and discourages some students from working as hard as they might. I think it's very important to give more support to top students. especially those who get a red certificate, because they have studied hard for a long time. They should get a special offer from the government

or other organisations to motivate them to study harder and be industrious. The concerned bodies and the college or university should offer them a special gift because it would raise the profile of the institution and encourage other students to follow their example.

Mr Auan Keomany, a student in Xaythany district: This is an important issue that both public and private universities and colleges should pay attention to. Like every other student, I would like to be declared an excellent student but this might not be easy for me. All students want the government or some other body to provide special

gifts to outstanding students especially to those who are awarded a red certificate. As everyone knows, being named an excellent student or graduating with a certificate of honour or red certificate is no easy task. A student



has to work really hard to achieve a good score in every subject. Besides having good averages, one must have good qualifications in all aspects. I think excellent students are worthy people and the government should use various ways to praise and reward them, or do something that encourages others to excel, and also provide scholarships for them so they can study at a higher level either in Laos or overseas, as a reward for all their efforts and determination.

Mr Bounxou Bounchalern, an employee in Xieng Khuang province: I think the government, through the Ministry of Education and Sports, should give special opportunities to outstanding students and those with talent. Students who receive

a red certificate should be given special priority by the government, such as being given a job or a scholarship to continue their studies overseas. The government or other entity should create competitions in various fields of study in order to identify the most outstanding students and thus develop human resources in all fields. This would be a good way to encourage students and schoolchildren throughout the country to pay more attention to their studies and display their special abilities. It was good that activities took place in schools and universities each year to encourage students to be conscientious and produce outstanding students in each subject. But it turned out that the reward



they didn't receive anything special.

Ms Sakhone Luangkhod, a businesswoman in Pakxe district, Champassak *province:* As the mother of a student I would like the government to encourage and support the best students



through a special policy that would reward them with a good job after graduation so they were well cared for by the state. Or they should be given the opportunity to work in the subject or field they are good at. Many students are particularly good at some subjects but they can't get a job in that field after graduation because there is no government policy to support this and nothing is said about it. I have heard that many countries actively support their best students or talented students in various ways. They support them to continue their studies or allow them to work in their chosen field. This means that field will gain expertise and its development will accelerate. Laos should have a similar system. If we make the best use of our human resources, every field will improve more quickly.

Chinese takeovers of overseas brands worthy of attention

CHINA (China Daily) -- It is surprising that takeovers of international companies and brands by Chinese enterprises have received so little media coverage despite three major deals being struck in the first few weeks of January 2016 alone.

The most remarkable of the deals involved Chinese household appliance maker Haier. The Chinese company not only acquired General Electric's appliance unit for a staggering US\$5.4 billion, but also made clear its intent to make a mark in markets in both East and West.

Given the state of the world economy, it is important that Chinese companies gain a strong foothold in the more lucrative and competitive markets of the United States and Europe, and Haier's takeover of the American company's unit will boost their confidence in this regard.

The deal will allow Haier to use the GE brand and all its relative aspects for its appliances for the next 40 years. The immediate benefits to Haier and the Chinese economy are clear, but looking

at long-term gains is perhaps even more important. GE's advanced manufacturing technology and impressive brand building provide major learning opportunities for Haier and will help it to emulate GE's global presence.

By not giving due coverage to the takeovers, media outlets have also undermined the fact that Haier appears to have outbid and out-maneuvered many other major appliance makers such as Electrolux and has its sights firmly set on US market leader Whirlpool.

Chinese companies are targeting takeovers that offer long-term learning and strategic repositioning opportunities. The Krauss-Maffei acquisition by the China National Chemical Corporation is another example in this regard. The Krauss-Maffei Group is widely recognised as one of the leading manufacturer of machines and systems for plastic and rubber production and processing.

What was really striking is that just days after the Krauss-Maffei acquisition came the news that Dalian Wanda had reached an agreement to take over Hollywood-based

Legendary Entertainment for US\$3.5 billion, the largest Hollywood takeover to date by a Chinese company.

The size and significance of the three takeovers notwithstanding, they should not be viewed in isolation. Instead, more media coverage of this growing trend is needed, in order to present a far more balanced picture of the real Chinese economy, especially because the takeover trend is likely to grow, and the Belt and Road Initiative and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank will help Chinese companies in their international takeover bids.

Of course, growth through acquisition is fraught with difficulties and challenges highlighted by a 60 percent failure rate. But that is all the more reason why the majority of Chinese overseas takeovers are impressive their targets appear to offer complementary products, markets and skills, and all have a string of successful, global brands.

It seems Chinese companies today are better equipped to manage the complex process of postacquisition integration, not

least because they retain talented professionals, and blend styles and cultural backgrounds.

It should be clear to all that Chinese companies are pursuing growth through overseas takeovers not for short-term financial gains but to build a key plank in their long-term, global brand-building process.

Let's hope media outlets will cover such takeovers more widely, as they should have done in the first place, instead of simply focusing on a few macro-economic indicators such as quarterly GDP figures, because Chinese companies are not just looking to penetrate the more lucrative European and US markets but are also on

the lookout for those European and US companies and brands that would help them further penetrate the Chinese market.





COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. to just stay calm. At the end, I (AP) -- Gritting her teeth in pain, and wobbling ever so slightly aboard her sleek time trial bike, Evelyn Stevens kept churning her legs even as the clock hit one hour and she could finally let up.

Just call it a victory lap.

The American rider shattered the hour record, one of cycling's most revered marks, by riding just under 30 miles (47.98 kilometers) inside the Olympic Training Centre Velodrome on Saturday. Stevens covered more than 143 laps on the 333-metre track, easily surpassing the 46.833 kilometers Bridie O'Donnell went last month.

"I worked a lot on the mental prep for this," Stevens said. "In the beginning, I really wanted

"I can't believe this many people came to watch me. Knowing that made me go a little harder," she said later. "I think the coolest thing about today is all the support."

Stevens passed O'Donnell's mark with more than a minute remaining and nearly eclipsed Jeannie Longo's mark of 48.149 set in 1996. But that distance, referred to as the "best human effort," was set using a "superwoman" position no longer allowed under current hour-record rules set by cycling's governing body two years ago — and would have merely been a nice exclamation mark on her record.

"I was able to really hit my splint times. I wanted to bring it down faster at the end," Stevens said, "but you don't really know your limit until you get there."

Stevens, a member of the got into her time-trial tuck 2012 London Olympic team, plans to return to Boulder for some rest before joining the rest of her road team for their upcoming European season. And she hopes strong performances there will help secure her spot on the US team for the Rio Olympics.

"I can't wait to join my teammates, who are kicking butt over there," she said.

His first break at stand 3-2 was quickly re-broken by "Stan the Man" as the Swiss is nicknamed who showed more precision and endurance in standard situations.


Both elite players appeared to be exhausted, the Greek Cypriot in particular as he needed three sets against Spaniard Feliciano Lopez to win Friday's second semifinal.

Followed by Argentine football legend Diegoo Maradona from the tribune of honour, the match remained on a medium level with rare breathtaking shots.

It was also a fair encounter when at the start of the second set, Lausanne-born Wawrinka smashed a high ball volley and hit the Cypriot in his stomach, the Swiss immediately apologised under loud applause of the audience. The two opponents almost mutually avoided direct attacks at the net and relied on their baseline shots.

The second set was almost a photocopy of the first round and the two headed into the inevitable tie-break.

"Stan the Man", dressed in his favourite funky red-orange combination, cashed in 511,750 US dollars prize money and fireworks enlightened the sky above the stadium.

Sponsorship money rolls in for Lao university games

The National University of Laos (NUOL) is continuing to mobilise funding support from local companies for the 1st Lao University Games, to run from March 5-15.

On Friday, the university received a huge boost from the Lao Brewery Company in the form of 500 million kip, along with sponsorship from other local companies.

Deputy Managing Director of the Lao Brewery Company, Mr Sounthone Sirisack, and representatives of other companies handed donations to NUOL President, Professor Dr Soukkongseng Saignaleuth, and members of the games' organising committee.

Prof. Dr Soukkongseng explained that the government had a limited budget for the university games.

He called on the competition organising committee to be well prepared for all aspects of the games, and hoped they would be a great success.

He said the NUOL would be a good host and hoped to top the gold medal rankings as that would be a fitting celebration for the university's 20th anniversary this year.

Meanwhile the university urges other companies and organisations to step forward and support the country's first university games.

The NUOL is providing accommodation and sports facilities as well as assembling trainers from many provinces. It has also set up committees to oversee food, health, public security, the opening and closing ceremonies, and transport.

Competitors will come from NUOL, the University of Health Sciences, and universities in Champassak, Luang Prabang and Savannakhet provinces, as well as the Army Academy, Police Academy, and private and state colleges.

Some 1,000 students from NUOL's various faculties will perform at the games' opening ceremony on March 5.

During the closing

ceremony, NUOL will pass on responsibility for the second Lao National University Games to Champassak University, which will host the event in 2019.

NUOL's goal for the first edition of the games is to build friendship between students from the different universities and to develop students' sporting talent.

NUOL will select the best performing athletes to compete at the Asean University Games in Singapore in June.

The 1st Lao University Games will include badminton, table tennis, basketball, futsal, petanque, taekwondo, volleyball and beach volleyball, basketball, as well as track and field events.

Some 311 gold, 311 silver and 332 bronze medals will be up for grabs.

NUOL hosted the 16th Asean University Games in 2012, when its students won 32 gold, 35 silver and 46 bronze medals. NUOL students also competed at the Asean University Games in Indonesia in 2014.
